

How to go with the grain

What does it mean to go with the grain?

To go with the grain (idiom) = to accept something rather than oppose it or fight against it. "The grain " refers to the grain in a plank of wood. If you rub the wood with (in the direction of) the grain, the wood feels smooth; if you rub the wood against (in the opposite direction to) the grain, the wood feels sharp and rough and you may be cut.
